Dear Friends,

This month we celebrate Easter! The amazing story of Jesus dying for our sins, restoring our relationship with God, and rising triumphantly to new life!

At church we will hear again the story of those who first found Jesus alive again. We will be reminded that it is Mary Magdalene waiting at the tomb who is the first to meet the risen Christ, who speaks to her while she is sobbing, meaningfully saying her name. She then goes and tells his disciples about this, presumably with much joy!

What a story! There is so much to consider. Today though, as I write this barely in March, after a year so far of rain nearly every day, and several people seemingly rather tired, fragile or struggling in various ways, it is the joyful aspect I am drawn to. We often overlook the point that to find this joy, Mary had to look for it, and to wait. If Mary had stayed away from the tomb, she would have missed this most amazing encounter. As it is, she is the first person to meet the risen Jesus, who comes when she is crying, when she is low, weary and confused.

This is sometimes one of the Easter messages we forget in the midst of the excitement of new life, forgiveness, and yes, also Easter eggs! The message that God comes close and brings joy, even to those who weep, sometimes in the most unexpected of places and unusual of situations. It is a story of joy out of grief, as well as life out of death.

So at Easter we celebrate a God who knows us, truly knows us as God was one of us. God who knows our struggles, weaknesses and griefs, and who comes to us in the middle of them, caringly saying our name, and gently pointing us to joy and life again.

Unfortunately, that joy does not always come quickly, or in a large way with laughter or celebration. Sometimes it simply starts to slowly creep in, perhaps with a little reminder we are not alone, or with a moment we find we have appreciated, which could be as simple as the noticing a beautiful rainbow. It is likely something we have to seek or allow in -Looking for signs of life, not denying our sorrow or the situations we are in, but choosing to turn up anyway, remaining open to God meeting us.

Faith does not mean we have no difficult times. It does mean sorrow is not the ending message. Even in the waiting and the tears, Jesus is near, with you. Easter reminds us God is always there, and that even in places of sadness, new life of hope, love and joy will come again. And, if this Easter you are already in that bright and hopefully place, remember to give thanks for the love and peace in your life.

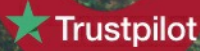
On Monday evenings during Lent there has been a study group following the diocese programme Set Our Hearts on Fire . It has been an interesting time to explore topics such as how to build our faith into everyday life, not saving it for Sunday, exploring learning and how to follow Jesus commandment to love one another.....

We start with the written notes but have quickly spun off into discussion that extends far and wide. There have been about a dozen people attending on a regular basis and I have especially enjoyed sharing the study sessions with both well established members of our church community and those who have joined more recently, bringing a wealth of different opinions and questions.

On the theme of Generosity we discussed how difficult it is for people to be open about money – what we give and where we give , what we prioritise in our family life and as Christians. This led us down some interesting pathways about giving with joy and gratitude but it also led to discussion about the sense of community and caring for one another. Sometimes we do not know what people are struggling with, it maybe sorrow, redundancy, illness , questions of faith and yet if these difficulties could be acknowledged in a respectful way then maybe the support of prayer would help. The Prayer list is for anyone who feels that they would appreciate our prayers as a church community . Some of you may not want public prayer requests but would be happy to know that our small regular prayer group is remembering you and that Rev George always holds all who she knows need her support in prayer. Please ask if you would like this support and if you feel that you are recovering or in a better frame of mind then ask to be removed from the lists.

The last session will focus on the wonder of experiencing God's presence as we work towards the range of emotions found in Holy Week – from the joy and adulation of Palm Sunday through the increasingly difficult pathway to the crucifixion but then the wonder and celebration of Easter Sunday.

Garden Fete preparation

The 2nd Saturday in July has been the date of the annual Garden Fete for as long as I can remember, over 60 years now! I think in all that time it has been cancelled once and moved to September twice although those with more reliable memories will doubtless correct me if I am wrong. This year it falls on July 11th and if this date is not already in our diary get up now and immediately put it in.



Arrangements are beginning to be firmed up. The usual stalls and games will be there and entertainment in both the rectory garden and the church are planned. The Green School is booked for refreshments and even at this stage we are confident that the weather will be neither too hot nor too cold and definitely not wet. However, none of this will happen without everyone pulling together to make this our major fundraising and community event of the year. Stop

looking sheepishly at your feet and avoiding eye contact, I am talking directly to YOU. How can you help? At this stage you can indicate your willingness to help on the day: manning a stall or a game, serving refreshments, moving heavy stuff at the beginning or end of the day, lending gazebos for the garden or parasols for the Green School or trolleys for moving stuff from one place to another. Susanne, Nick, Kate, Andrew, Rev George will all be delighted to hear from you.

You can also help beforehand by asking businesses and householders for contributions for the various raffles and the tombola stall. We will also need help delivering flyers around the town, ideally to every house, an undertaking which grows more extensive every year as our community grows. Small prizes of sweets for the children's games are needed and if you can slip a packet into your weekly shop now and again then let Andrew have them a few weeks beforehand. It will save us money providing them. If you are planning a massive spring clean and declutter soon then please hang on to books, jigsaws, toys etc that can be sold on

the stalls or bigger unwanted new(ish) items that can go on the silent auction. We can't store them ourselves but will let you know when you can drop them off or have them picked up much nearer the time.

We haven't been able to run a dedicated plant stall in recent years but if keen gardeners have spare cuttings or extra seedlings, please nurture them and bring them to us at the Garden Fete, I'm sure we'll find space for them somewhere. Of course, if you have ambitions to run a plant stall please get in touch.

That's about all at this stage but I will continue to nag you in a more focused way over the coming months. Please think prayerfully about how you can support this eagerly anticipated annual event.

Ladies' Guild.

Members and guests were treated to an interesting talk by Mick Smith, accompanied by his 2 peregrine falcons, Paco and Chanel, aged 4 and 3 years old. He explained how he had trained both birds and how he takes them out every day hunting (with the aid of a drone) from September to January/February. They are in the breeding aviary from February until August.

Mick has learned how to make his own leather hoods for the birds and told us that they only hunt feathered prey. He recounted the story of how one of the birds had recently slipped its tether whilst outside and was lost for several days, eventually being recaptured after several misleading sightings and miles of walking!


Mick's passion and enthusiasm for falconry shone through and some members were lucky enough to be able to hold one of the falcons after the talk. Carol Moore gave a vote of thanks.
