Have you ever attended a Taizé service? If not, why not give the one at 4 pm on Sunday August 9th a go? Many churches and cathedrals do these occasionally and they can be very popular with those who like a time of quiet reflection. Each church generally does their own version but common to them all is the music: short chants repeated 6 or 7 times as an aid to devotion. They are very easy to pick up and join in with but if you prefer to

simply listen that's OK. Some places are blessed with a group of musicians who can accompany the chants and a cantor who can lead the singing but there are CDs with the music on and that is what we use in our services.

There are some short Bible readings, usually just a single verse, and an opportunity to reflect on them; some short prayers with responses to join in with and plenty of time for silent prayer. Whether you enjoy contemplative worship or are new to it, this type of service may help you find peace and refreshment. We hope to see you there.

To Love and Serve the Lord

Whether you're just beginning to explore your faith or have had a faith and been coming to church for many years, *To Love and Serve the Lord* is a course designed to help you pause, reflect and grow. There are six sessions which offer a space to think deeply about your own faith journey and to develop your understanding of key areas of faith such as prayer and the Bible. As it covers the basics of a Christian life, it is suitable for those exploring faith as well as those who wish to make a deeper connection with their faith. It will be a chance to learn, ask questions, reflect, explore new perspectives, and deepen your relationship with God —whatever stage you are at.

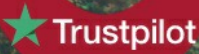
These sessions are open to anyone who is interested in exploring their faith more fully.

As well as this, the course is offered this year for adults preparing for Confirmation. So, some on the course might be considering Confirmation, while others may simply want to reconnect or grow in their understanding. While this course also serves as the introductory module for those considering Authorised Lay Ministry training in the Diocese of Lincoln, participation is not limited to those pursuing ministry. So you can come along whatever stage you are at, if you are confirmed or not, or considering it or not – It is for everyone.

The sessions, which have been produced by the Diocese of Lincoln, are open to everyone in the Welland Local Mission Partnership, and Christians of any denomination locally. They will be led by Rev Mark Williams and will run on Mondays from September 8th to October 13th at 7:30pm in the Green School.

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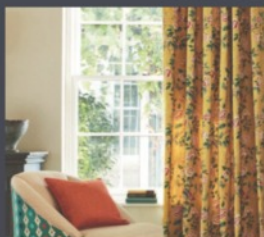
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Evacuation

As this year is the Eightieth Anniversary of the end of the Second World War it seems apposite to include a couple of stories about evacuation.

At the outbreak of WW2 in 1939 politicians realised that London was a likely target for aerial bombing, a view reinforced by the carnage in the Spanish Civil War which Germany supported and used as a training ground for its Air Force bombers and fighters. Consequently arrangements were put in place to evacuate children from London to safe rural areas.

There are many stories of varying experiences; some children were well cared for by their temporary families, some were not. These two stories are about evacuees with family connections to my late wife, Shirley.

Shirley's parents lived in the Greenwich / Charlton area, as did those of Ken who Shirley married years later. The area was vulnerable to bombing because of the Naval College and the docks across the Thames. Shirley and Ken were too young to be evacuated but the latter's brother George, born 1935, was evacuated to a farm in Newbridge-on-Wye, central Wales. Now, a young boy from the confines and busyness of London being placed in the green countryside would either love it or hate it. He loved it!

As the bombing threat diminished the evacuees returned to their families in London and resumed normal life. However as soon as he was old enough George (later Shirley's brother-in-law) left Charlton and returned to the farm in Wales, married a local girl and settled down to farming until his death in 1978.

This second story concerns Shirley's uncle, Robert Warren, who lived in West London and had six children, five of whom were evacuated to America. Robert worked for the Hoover Vacuum Cleaner Company in West London, the President of which was Herbert Hoover (no relation to the politician) who arranged for approximately one hundred of his English employees' children to go to Canton, Ohio in America. They set out from Liverpool in The

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Samalia on 9th August and when in America they were accommodated with American employees of the company.

Imagine the feelings of an eight-year-old moving from a three-bedroom semi, housing at that time two parents and six children, to your own bedroom with indulgent foster-carers, and no rationing. The Warren children returned home in 1945 to a home with four more siblings (and another in 1947).

One of the five, Dorothy, went on to work for Hoover, met and married a visiting executive and emigrated to Canton where she died a few years ago. A month after The Somalia sailed a similar ship carrying evacuee children was torpedoed and only a few survived, the practice then ceased.
