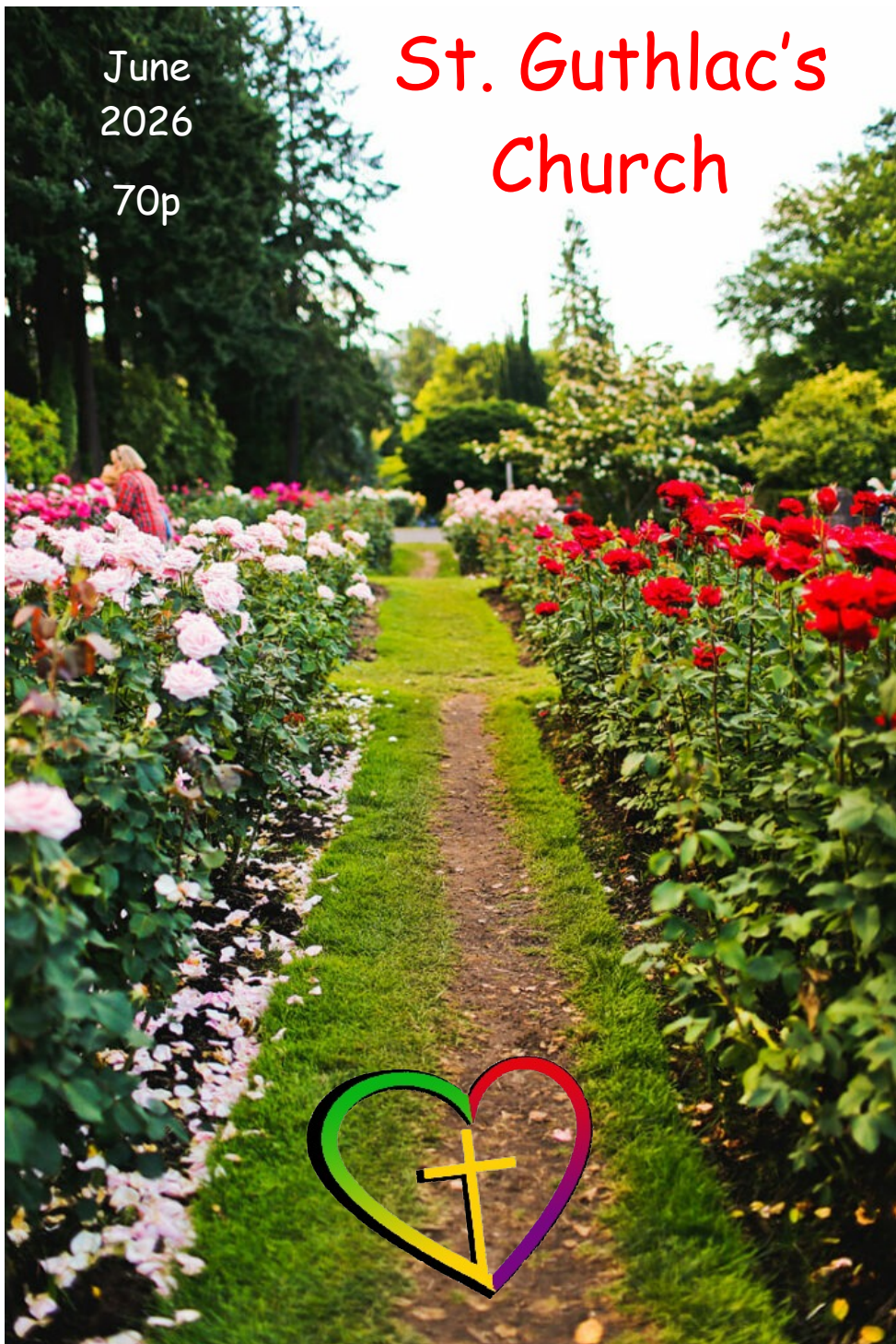

*Dear Friends,*

June – the month with the longest day, the potential for the most sunshine yet, as I prepare this, the central heating has been turned back on again, thick jumpers and coats dug out from winter's wardrobe and the weather forecasters threaten snow!

June – but I don't know where April went. I missed April. I spent much of it in hospital and then the rest of the time learning how to be as independent as possible.

I have learnt so much since 23 March, the day of my nerve root decompression surgery. I have learnt how easy it is to wallow in self-pity, to look, with despair, at an uncertain future, to give in. Last night's Bible Course we were looking at the Exodus. God heard the cries of His chosen people and He prepared to answer their prayers and redeem them from their captivity and slavery in Egypt. We started the evening by sharing experiences of times when we had felt trapped, even imprisoned. A common experience for all of us was lockdown because of Covid. Even for me, in the countryside of the Chilterns, we were unable to meet together to worship. Singing hymns on your own at home with others via Zoom eventually paled.

But God had a plan to redeem His chosen people. He chose a runaway murderer who had spent the past 40 years tending sheep and sent Moses to Pharaoh to say, "Let my people go!". And God promised Moses that He, the great I AM, would be with Moses always as He fulfilled His promise.

We all have uncertain futures. Although we might make plans for tomorrow, next week or even the years to come, the future is uncertain. Was I despairing about the future before my operation?

Are you despairing of yours? So why, now my circumstances have changed, should I despair? My future was always uncertain as is yours. My future is in the hands of a loving God.

Of course it's likely that your circumstances are bleaker than mine. The Israelites were made slaves by the Egyptians and made to build pyramids. Every male son was to be killed. I love those first few verses of Exodus chapter 3. God tells Moses that He's seen the plight of His people and He's going to deliver them. Have you seen the pyramids? They weren't built in a day! Indeed its likely the Israelites were slaves for over 200 years! Many will have died slaves.

I am reminded of an old chorus we used to sing.

I know who holds the future, and I know He holds my hand;  
With God things don't just happen, everything by Him is planned.

So as I face tomorrow with its problems large and small  
I'll trust the God of miracles, give to Him my all.

Whatever our future, God holds it and us in His hand so there is no need to despair, quite the opposite in fact.

As we finished the session on Exodus we were given a verse to meditate on, a verse from Joshua chapter 1.

God said, "I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go."

# Summer and the Environment: Caring for God's Creation

As we start to enter the season of summer, I am reminded of one of my favourite anthems in church 'For the beauty of the earth' by John Rutter. For me it captures the essence of summer.

We begin to welcome longer days, warmer weather, blooming gardens, and opportunities to spend time outdoors. Whether we are walking through the countryside, sitting in a local park, or enjoying time with family and friends outside, summer reminds us of the beauty and generosity of God's creation.

In Genesis, we read that God looked upon creation and declared it "very good." At this time of the year I have to agree. The earth, skies, seas, trees, and living creatures are all part of the wonderful world entrusted to us. Summer gives us a fresh opportunity to notice these gifts more closely — the sound of birdsong in the morning, colourful flowers in full bloom, sunlight warming the earth, and the abundance of food growing in the fields or in our gardens.

Alongside this beauty, we are increasingly aware of environmental challenges. Rising temperatures, pollution, flooding, droughts, and loss of wildlife affecting communities across the world. These issues can sometimes feel distant or overwhelming, but as Christians we are called not only to appreciate creation, but also to care for it faithfully. We need to be active in this area.

Stewardship is a deeply biblical principle. God gave humanity responsibility to "tend and keep" the garden. Caring for the environment is not simply a political or scientific concern (although they are certainly part of the solution); it is also a spiritual responsibility. Looking after creation is one way of

showing love for God and for our neighbours, especially future generations who will inherit the world we leave behind. I catch myself thinking about what the future might be for my children and their future children too.

Summer is an ideal time to reflect on the ways we can make a difference. Small actions matter. We can reduce waste, recycle more carefully, avoid unnecessary plastic use, conserve water during dry weather, and support local produce. Planting flowers for bees and butterflies, keeping gardens wildlife-friendly, or simply spending more time walking instead of driving can all contribute to healthier communities and a healthier planet.

At St Guthlac's Church we can also play an important role. We focus more on our outside spaces by letting some areas of the churchyard grow wild, we have future proofed our heating and lighting and allowed for the use of renewable energy, we are planning to organise a litter-picking event, and are teaching our young people about creation care. These activities not only benefit the environment but also strengthen fellowship and witness within the community.

Importantly, caring for creation is rooted in hope rather than fear. Christians believe that God has not abandoned the world He made. Every act of care, however small, reflects gratitude and hope for the protection and renewal of creation. When we protect the environment, we participate in God's ongoing work of restoration and healing.

This summer, may we take time to slow down and notice the beauty around us. Listen to the birds and watch the nature living alongside us. May we give thanks for sunshine and rain, for fields and forests, for gardens and wildlife. And may we renew our commitment to being faithful stewards of the earth, honouring God the Creator through the way we care for His creation.

# *Ladies' Guild.*

We welcomed Justin Tilley who presented the Landyke Countryside Trust. He featured John Clare the 'peasant poet' who said that he found the poems in the fields and only wrote them down. John Clare was malnourished as a child and only grew to 5ft. He understood the countryside and was devastated in 1810 with the Enclosure Act being introduced. He had a wife and seven children but died in an asylum in 1864.

The Landyke Trust started in 1999 with four people, and it has now grown to have nine nature reserves. They conduct weekly walk parties and do monthly talks and walks. He gave an interesting insight into the work of the Trust. He is only a very passionate volunteer and member of the Committee.

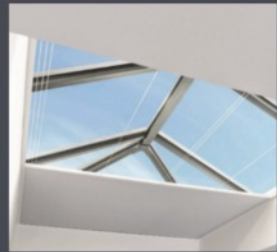
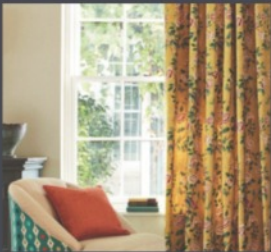
