As we move into October, the days shorten, leaves turn golden and brown, and hedgerows are full of fruit. There is something about the autumn season that encourages us to notice the changing beauty and abundance within creation, and of course to give thanks for this.

Harvest, at its heart, is about gratitude. It is an opportunity to remember that all we have is a gift from God – the food on our tables, the shelter of our homes, the company of family and friends. On Sunday 5th October 10am, at our Harvest Service, we will gather to offer our thanks, not only for the harvest produce, but for all the ways God provides for us.
